Supervisor Sheen explained the sequence of events that led up to the No Parking signs being installed and stated he had spoken to Elmira City School Superintendent Hillary Austin, who stated that the School District and Bus Garage do not have an issue with having them taken down. Mr. Lewis stated that all the neighbors signed the petition in favor of the removal of the signs.

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Council Member Roman made a motion, Council Member Gunderman seconded to refer to the Town of Southport Planning Board Petitions from residents of Pennsylvania Avenue, Pine City, NY, to remove the No Parking signs adjacent to Pine City Elementary School.

#### **7:15 p.m.** – Discussion of 2015 Audit

Supervisor Sheen introduced Patrick Jordan, CPA, Partner of Insero & Co., CPAs, who presented the 2015 audit reports. Mr. Jordan presented an Executive Summary that outlined the 2015 year with a five-year comparison.

Mr. Jordan stated that all financials were in order. Expenses exceeded revenues by \$557,031.00, which was due to the reduction of sales tax by the County to Towns.

The total fund balance is \$3,379,389.00 compared to \$3,796,160.00 for the year 2014. All of the fund balance is assigned or restricted for the year of 2016.
