Supervisor Sheen introduced Patrick Jordan, CPA, Partner of Insero & Co., CPAs, who presented the 2016 audit reports. Mr. Jordan presented an Executive Summary that outlined the 2016 year with a five-year comparison.

Mr. Jordan stated that all financials were in order. Expenses exceeded revenues by \$612,103.00, which was due to the reduction of sales tax by the County to Towns.

The total fund balance is \$2,915,503.00 compared to \$3,379,389.00 for the year 2015. All of the fund balance is assigned or restricted for the year 2017.

RESOLUTION NO. 105-2017

LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 2017

A LOCAL LAW OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHPORT, NEW YORK TO OVERRIDE THE TAX LEVY LIMIT ESTABLISHED IN GENERAL MUNICIPAL LAW SECTION 3-c

Resolution by: Gunderman Seconded by: Szerszen

WHEREAS, the Town of Southport wishes to enact a local law to allow the Town of Southport to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-c for the year commencing January 1, 2017, and

WHEREAS, this proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2017 to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-c, thereof in its final form having been upon the desks of members of the Board for at least seven (7) calendar days, exclusive of Sunday, prior to this day, and a public hearing having been duly held on June 13, 2017 before the Board upon public notice provided by law, and the said proposed local law having been read in its final form at this meeting.

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NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that said proposed Local Law No. 3 of 2017 to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law Section 3-c, is hereby adopted and enacted, to wit:

# Section 1: Legislative Intent

It is the intent of this local law to allow the Town of Southport to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the "tax levy limit" as defined by General Municipal Law section 3-c,

# Section 2: Authority

This local law is adopted pursuant to subdivision 5 of General Municipal Law section 3-c, which expressly authorizes a local government's governing body to override the property tax cap for the coming fiscal year by the adoption of a local law approved by a vote of sixty percent (60%) of said governing body.

# Section 3: Tax Levy Limit Override

The Town Board of the Town of Southport, New York, County of Chemung is hereby authorized to adopt a budget for the fiscal year commencing January 1, 2017 that requires a real property tax levy in excess of the amount otherwise prescribed in General Municipal Law section 3-c.

## Section 4: Severability

If a court determines that any clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or the application thereof to any person, firm or corporation, or circumstance is invalid or unconstitutional, the court's order or judgment shall not affect, impair, or invalidate the remainder of this local law, but shall be confined in its operation to the clause, sentence, paragraph, subdivision, or part of this local law or in its application to the person, individual, firm or corporation or circumstance, directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment or order shall be rendered.

### Section 7: Effective Date

This local law shall take effect immediately upon filing with the Secretary of State.

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## RESOLUTION NO. 106-2017

### ESTABLISHING A TAX CAP RESERVE FUND FOR 2018 TOWN OF SOUTHPORT LIGHTING DISTRICT #1

Resolution by: Roman Seconded by: Hurley

WHEREAS, the Town Supervisor of the Town of Southport has requested that the Town of Southport establish a Tax Cap Reserve Fund for 2018 Town of Southport Lighting District #1 in the amount of SEVEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED EIGHTY TWO DOLLARS AND 00/100 (\$7,882.00) to cover a deficit of increased electrical costs of Southport Lighting District #1.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that pursuant to Section 6-d of the General Municipal Law, as amended, there is hereby established a reserve fund to be known as the "Town of Southport Tax Cap Reserve Fund" (hereinafter "Reserve Fund"). The purpose of this Reserve Fund is to set aside money to cover the excess cost of the Town of Southport Lighting District #1. The estimated maximum amount is \$7,882.00, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Supervisor is hereby directed to deposit and secure the moneys of this Reserve Fund in the manner provided by Section 10 of the General Municipal Law. The Town Supervisor may invest the moneys in the Reserve Fund in the manner provided by Section 11 of the General Municipal Law, and consistent with the investment policy of the Town of Southport. Any interest earned or capital gains realized on the moneys so deposited or invested shall accrue to and become part of the Reserve Fund. The Town Supervisor shall account for the Reserve Fund in a manner which maintains the separate identity of the cash and investments of the Reserve Fund, and be it further

RESOLVED, that except as otherwise provided by Section 6-d of the General Municipal Law, expenditures from this Reserve Fund shall be made only for the purpose for which the Reserve Fund is established. No expenditure shall be made from this Reserve Fund without the approval of the Town Board of the Town of Southport and without such additional actions or proceedings as may be required by Section 6-d for the General Municipal Law.

WHEREAS, the Town of Southport is hereby in possession of surplus land that is no longer needed for a Town purpose; and

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WHEREAS, the said surplus property is commonly known as the "walkway" or "walk" which is twenty-five wide running easterly from the circle of Circuit Drive to Plymouth Avenue in the Town of Southport and was transferred to the Town by Warranty Deed with Robert Street, Universal Avenue, Curtis Street, Strouse Avenue, Sherman Avenue, Plymouth Avenue, Allen Street, and Marion Street from B. and E. Homes, Inc. on or about April 13, 1943 and referenced in Case Map No. 895; and

WHEREAS, Frank and Harriet Bierline who own property located at 1062 Plymouth Avenue, Elmira, New York, 14904 and Marrilyn Matthews who owns property located at 9 Circuit Drive, Elmira, New York, 14904 are interested in purchasing the portion of this walkway which is adjacent to each of their respective properties; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Southport intends to sell the aforementioned land to Frank and Harriet Bierline and Marrilyn Matthews for the fair market value; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Southport sell surplus property known as the "walkway" or "walk" a portion of which is running easterly from the circle of Circuit Drive to Plymouth Avenue in the Town of Southport and was transferred to the Town by Warranty Deed with Robert Street, Universal Avenue, Curtis Street, Strouse Avenue, Sherman Avenue, Plymouth Avenue, Allen Street, and Marion Street from B. and E. Homes, Inc. on or about April 13, 1943 and referenced in Case Map No. 895 as two separate parcels: (1) a parcel which is adjacent on the northernly boundary to 1062 Plymouth Avenue, Elmira, New York 14904 and is one hundred thirty and five hundredths (130.05) feet in length on said boundary, twenty-five feet in width, one hundred thirty (130) feet in length on the southernly boundary and borders Plymouth Avenue on the easternly boundary to Frank and Harriet Bierline's property, the owner of adjacent property at 1062 Plymouth Avenue and (2) a parcel which is adjacent on the southernly boundary to 9 Circuit Drive, Elmira, New York, 14904 and is one hundred eighteen and six tenths (118.6) feet in length on said boundary, twenty-five feet in width, one hundred twelve and eight tenths (112.8) feet on the northernly boundary and borders Circuit Drive on the westernly boundary to Marrilyn Matthews' property, the owner of adjacent property 9 Circuit Drive; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of a Complete Streets Policy is to empower and direct citizens, elected officials, government agencies, planners, engineers, and architects to use an interdisciplinary approach, when possible, to incorporate the needs of all users into the design and construction of roadway projects within the Town of Southport, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Southport wishes to ensure that the appropriate designs and construction of roadways within the Town will accommodate the safety, convenience, and comfort of motorists, cyclists, pedestrians including those individuals requiring mobility aids, transit riders, and neighborhood residents of all ages and abilities, and

WHEREAS, the Town of Southport recognizes that this Complete Streets Policy also includes the incorporation of this community's values and as such will be mindful of its environmental, scenic, aesthetic, historic and natural resources in any such design and planning, and

WHEREAS, Complete Streets design features and practices include, but are not limited to: sidewalks, proper street lighting, signage, crosswalk and crosswalk devices, highway improvements, and parking areas in order to promote healthy and safe activity by users.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Southport recognizes the importance of creating this Complete Streets Policy as listed in the whereas within the Town to assure safe travel by all users including motorists, cyclists, pedestrians, public transportation riders & drivers, and people of all ages and abilities, including children, youth, families, older adults, and individuals with disabilities, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Town of Southport will attempt to draw upon all possible funding sources to plan and implement where possible Complete Street elements to make implementation economical feasible, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Southport will consider incorporating Complete Streets design features and practices in the planning and design process into any construction, reconstruction, retrofit, maintenance, alteration, or repair of streets, bridges, or other portions of the transportation network wherever feasible.

Dick Craft from 800 Spruce Street also commented that when turning off of Country Lane onto Pennsylvania Avenue it is hard to see around the stop sign because of overgrowth. Dave Bachman will look into this.

Mark Watts from 6 Groff Road, Horseheads commented on vacant house at 992 Pauline Avenue, Pine City.

Marshall Leljedal from 976 Pauline Avenue commented on the vacant house at 992 Pauline Avenue, as well as property at 975 Pauline Avenue.

Sue Johnston from 904 Sebring Avenue stated it is hard to pull out from Manor Drive onto Broadway because there is too much traffic and overgrowth. Dave Bachman will look into this as well.

Council Member Szerszen made a motion, Council Member Roman seconded to adjourn the meeting.
