7:18 P.M. – PUBLIC HEARING – for the purpose of hearing any and all public comment to consider the proposal to renew a Fire Protection Contract between the Town of Southport, on behalf of Fire Protection District No. 1 and the Southport Volunteer Firemen, Inc., which contract is to provide, among other things, that the Town of Southport, on behalf of Fire Protection District No. 1 shall pay to the Southport Volunteer Firemen, Inc., the sum of \$304,440.00 for the year 2019, \$310,440.00 for the year 2020, and \$316,640.00 for the year 2021 and to consider such other terms and conditions as may be agreed upon between the parties for the furnishing of fire protection in said district.

Town Clerk Carolyn Renko read the legal notice that appeared in the Star Gazette and opened the hearing for public comment.

No one wished to speak so the public portion of the Public Hearing was closed at 7:19 p.m.

Supervisor Sheen stated there was a minimal increase and he has reviewed the financials which are in order.

AUTHORIZING SUPERVISOR TO ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH SOUTHPORT VOLUNTEER FIREMEN, INC.

WHEREAS, this Town Board did on the 9th day of October, 2018, hold a public hearing for the purpose of considering the adoption of a contract for the Southport Volunteer Firemen, Inc., furnishing fire protection within Fire Protection District No. 1, all of which was done in accordance with the notice duly published as provided, and

WHEREAS, all persons desiring to be heard were then and there heard, and

WHEREAS, due deliberation having been made by this Town Board,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that this Town Board finds and determines that it is in the best interest of the residents of Fire Protection District No. 1 that the Town of Southport enter into a new contract with Southport Volunteer Firemen, Inc., at a yearly contract price as follows:

First Year (2019)	THREE HUNDRED AND FOUR THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS (\$304,440.00)
Second Year (2020)	THREE HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS (\$310,440.00)
Third Year (2021)	THREE HUNDRED SIXTEEN THOUSAND, SIX HUNDRED FORTY DOLLARS (\$316,640.00)

and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Town Board of the Town of Southport does hereby authorize and direct the Town Supervisor on behalf of Town of Southport Fire Protection District No. 1 to enter into a contract with Southport Volunteer Firemen, Inc., the terms and conditions of that contract to be subject to the review and approval of the Attorney for the Town.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, pursuant to the State Environmental Quality Review Act, 6 NYCRR, Part 617.6, the Town of Southport Town Board designates itself as lead agency for review of actions taken related to development of the site which includes parcels located at 1156 Broadway and 989, 987, 985 Sebring Avenue, Elmira, New York 14904, including demolition of any structures, and be it further

RESOLVED, that pursuant to the State Environmental Review Act (SEQR) and in accordance with Restore NY grant awarded to the Town of Southport, the demolition of structures located at 1156 Broadway and 989, 987, and 985 Sebring Avenue, Elmira, New York 14904 is an Unlisted Action and the Town Board prepared a short environmental assessment form as required by SEQR and as lead agency the Town determined that the proposed action will not have a significant impact on the environment, and be it further,
