WHEREAS, the Town of Southport Board wishes to sell this section of Laurentian Place to Travis McDonald; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Town acknowledges the receipt of the Highway Superintendent's Order which has been filed in the Town Clerk's office and further declares this section of Laurentian Place as described below and in the survey map dated December 19, 2019, designated Job No. 19766, made for Travis McDonald attached hereto, as surplus property; and

OPPOSING THE ADOPTION OF THE ACCELERATED RENEWABLE ENERGY GROWTH AND COMMUNITY BENEFIT ACT

WHEREAS, New York State Governor Cuomo has proposed the Accelerated Renewable Energy Growth and Community Benefit Act, and,

WHEREAS, adoption of this act into law would eliminate the application to local governments for large scale "renewable energy" production facilities by prospective developers, and,

WHEREAS, adoption of this act into State law would eliminate approval of large scale "renewable energy" production facilities by local governments, and,

WHEREAS, adoption of this act into law would likely eliminate all local government input or public comment as the application is being considered by New York State, and,

WHEREAS, adoption of this act into law would likely eliminate all locally developed PILOT agreements or host community benefit agreements for these projects, and,

WHEREAS, since it is vital that all local entities retain their ability to determine best uses for limited spaces that might be used for development of residential, commercial and agricultural purposes, now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Town of Southport is opposed to the adoption of the Accelerated Renewable Energy Growth and Community Benefit Act into New York State law, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Town of Southport will be opposed to any such similar action on the part of the State, regardless of the size and scope of any proposed facility.
